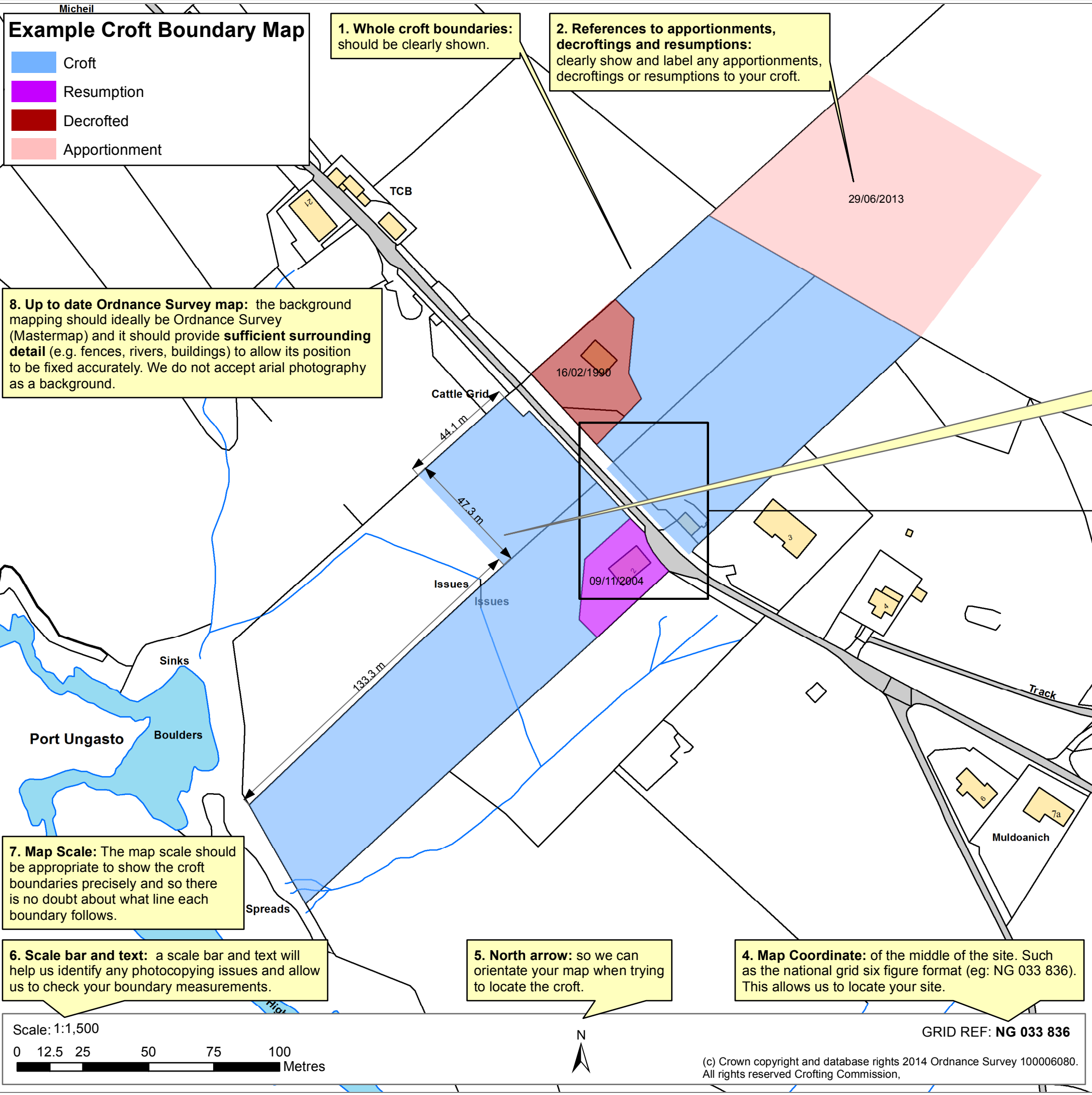


MAP FOR EXAMPLE PURPOSES ONLY



Further Guidelines:

- We recommend using a single map to show the entire croft boundary. Additional maps can be used to show extra detail as necessary.
- Annotation can be added to some or all of boundaries to ensure that they are mapped correctly, such as: 'boundary follows post and wire fence'.
- Decroftings, resumptions and apportionments should be consistent with the boundaries and area specified in the direction or order.
- Extracts of Ordnance Survey Mastermap can be obtained from several sources including Registers of Scotland for a small fee.

- If the map is being submitted for a regulatory application as well, such as decrofting or croft division, additional criteria will need to be met. Please refer to the guidelines and example maps attached to the application form. These can be found at www.crofting.scotland.gov.uk/documents.asp
